Kehinde Wiley Exhibition

A group of students went to visit the Kehinde Wiley exhibition at the Stephen Friedman Gallery in the West End, last week with Ms Daly and Mr O'Carroll.

The exhibition, 'In Search of the Miraculous', engages with both classical romanticism and epic maritime allegorical painting. In a series of seascape paintings, Wiley captures dramatic scenes of men battling perilous waves at sea and more contemplative and serene portraits of men on shorelines.

We hope the students are inspired in their own artwork by what they have seen, but also consider the metaphors depicted about everyday life and the challenges that young people face, growing up in the city.

AHT appointment
