### **Old Kent Road Redevelopment Visioning Workshop**

Last Wednesday TCSED welcomed London Borough of Southwark to the school to deliver a workshop to year 8 students regarding the redevelopment of Old Kent Road. The scheme is set to be completed by 2035 and as part of the consultation process LBoS sent a team of town planners, architects and regeneration experts to TCSED to get a fresh perspective on their designs.
