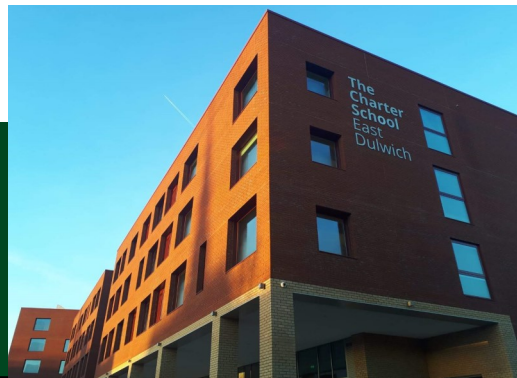

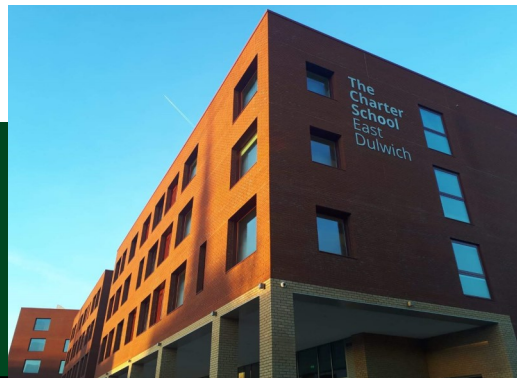

Merry Christmas in the Library

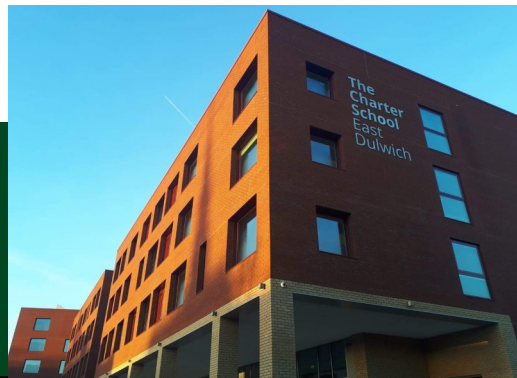

Year 9 Teenage Booster Injections

On Wednesday 22 January, the NHS School Immunisation team will be attending the school to administer the following vaccinations - Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio (Td/IPV) Meningococcal ACWY (MenACWY) These vaccinations are two single injections.

These vaccinations are not routinely offered at your GP's as this is a school-based immunisation. A detailed email will be sent with a copy of the information sheet and consent form. Please ensure that the consent form is returned to school Friday 17 January

Enrichment starts Monday 13 January

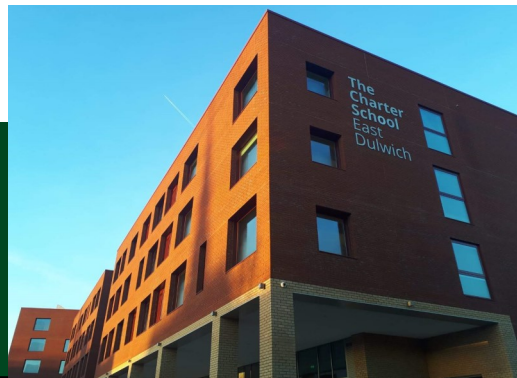
