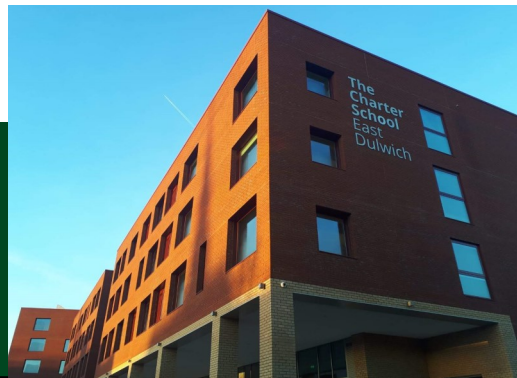

### Uniform and presentation

We would like to remind parents about our expectations of uniform and presentation, as this has slipped considerably since the return to school after the Easter break. A final reminder that hoodies are not allowed in school and will be confiscated at the gate (except for the PE school hoody on PE days). Coats should be plain black, dark grey or navy blue, with no additional logos or colours. Ideally, coats should be waterproof, but this is not essential. 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As our students increase in age, we are also seeing more make-up and jewellery, which are again banned items in school. Students should only wear a single pair of small matching plain gold or silver studs, one in each ear. Students who wear make-up to school, will be sent to Reception to remove it with a facial wipe or nail polish remover.
