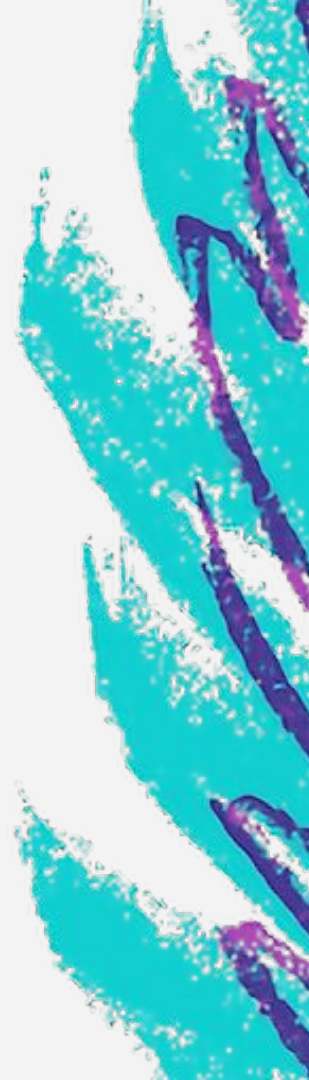

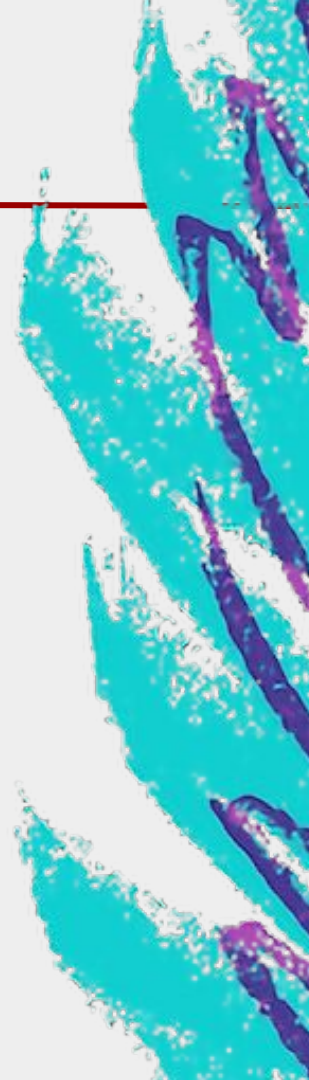

Artist Study Questions

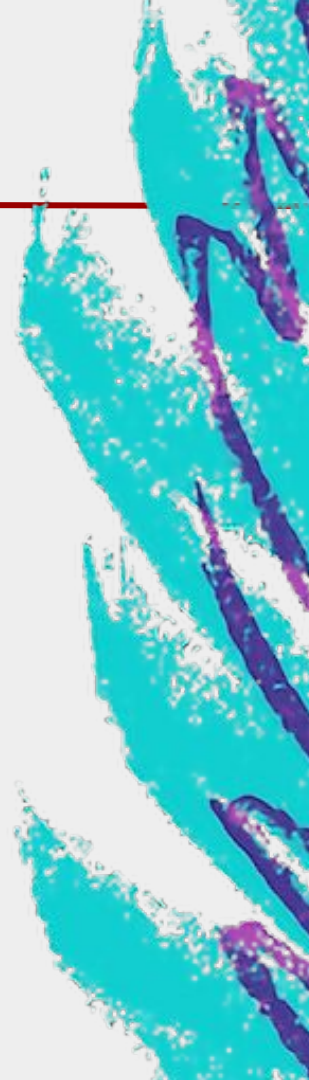
1. Who created this work and when?
2. Describe the work?
3. How has it been created? – include all possible technical information
4. Why do you think the artist has used these materials?
5. Why do you think the artist has used this subject matter?
6. Where have you seen and image like this before?
7. What do you think the work is trying to tell you? What is the concept?
8. Why do you think this technique has been used - how does the technique strengthen the concept?
9. What is original about this work?
10. How could you do something similar and link to your own ideas?



Objective 2 - Artist Response

- Create a piece of work inspired by the artist
- Experiment and take risks
- Take inspiration from the concept or the process
