On Friday 16th September the music department welcomed the composer (& parent) Harry Escott. Harry is a renowned composer and a frequent collaborator with Michael Winterbottom,, Paddy Considine, & Steve McQueen. His recent television credits include BBC One drama series Roadkill, for which he received a BAFTA award and Steve McQueen's Uprising for which he won the Royal Television Society award in 2021. He gave talks to the Year 10 and year 11 Music GCSE students during their music lessons and enlightened our students on his journey and career as a composer . He also gave out some top tips on how to approach their set brief compositions which is part of their coursework. During his talk, Harry gave us a detailed insight into his work for the recent ITV television drama series The Thief, His Wife and the Canoe. It was particularly enlightening to hear about how many versions of the same scene he had to compose music for to really capture the director's vision and create the right tone for the scene.
