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Applying to the Sixth Form

You can apply to as many sixth forms as you like (unlike application to Y7) and can hold multiple offers.

You can only apply to one of The Charter School Sixth Forms.

You need to attain the entry requirements on GCSE results day.



Our curriculum and courses

Students must choose 3 subjects, each with 5 hours on a timetable.

Use **Our Courses** page on our Website or download the prospectus.

Students may also choose an Extended Project Qualification or an AS in Further Maths (depending on timetabling.) Some may choose a Core Maths qualification..

Students complete their choices on the courses section of the online <u>application</u> form. They must select from the blocks. If you find that the blocks restrict your choice, please contact us via email and we will review, and on the application form choose the closest choices for now.



Wide range of courses

Arts & Technology: Fine Art, Photography, Music, Drama, Media Studies, Film Studies and Design and Technology.

Languages: English Literature, French and Spanish.

STEM: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Further Maths, Core Maths, PE and Computer Science.

Humanities & Social Sciences: Economics, Geography, History, Politics, Religion, Ethics and Philosophy, Sociology and Psychology.

Business Studies, Digital Games Production and Sport are available as BTECs



Extended Project Qualification


Opportunity to undertake an independent piece of work of student's choice.

Extended essay - Film - Event

Very helpful for UCAS personal statements.

Some universities offer lower grade requirements.

Highly competitive universities, including Oxford and Cambridge, recommend it.





Student timetables

Daily tutor time 08.30-9.00 - notices, opportunities, careers, Higher Education, PSHE, Current Affairs and more! Your tutor will also help students to be organised and become independent learners. This is important in transitioning from Y11 to Y12.

Assembly per week

15 hours of **timetabled lessons** (or more)

We expect you to complete a minimum of five hours of **independent study** (including homework) outside of lessons.


Timetabled supervised study to support you with transition to Y12.



Entry Requirements

Entry to the 6th form requires a minimum of five Grade 4-9 including Grade 4 in English language and maths.

Each subject will also have their own subject specific entry requirements. Use <u>Our Courses</u> page on our Website or download the Prospectus.



How should students choose subjects?

Choose subjects that students enjoy.

Choose subjects they **are good at** during KS4 – they get much harder at A level - students need to achieve the subject specific entry requirements.

Some degree subjects ask for specific A levels – check with universities.

Some A levels ('facilitating') keep your options open for longer – choose one or two of these if you don't know.

<u>Informed Choices</u> and offer advice. Also talk to the students and teachers this evening.



Working together with North Dulwich

This allows us to offer a wide curriculum to East Dulwich students.

The subjects offered at the North Dulwich site are **Music**, **Digital Games Production**, **Religion**, **Ethics and Philosophy and PE A levels**. There is information and teacher videos on the Our Courses section of the website if you are interested in these subjects.

We run trips and other opportunities together.



Facilities

All Sixth Form lessons, except Sport, are studied in B Block.

There is a **Sixth Form cafe**.

Sixth Form Study Spaces for supervised study and study periods.

More being built over the next two years on the East Dulwich hospital site.

Induction: you become a member of The Charter School East Dulwich Sixth Form.


Applying online
