Pastoral Information

I am enormously excited to be leading the Pastoral team this year as Deputy Headteacher. I am looking forward to working with all our families and students to help everyone be successful and enjoy school life.

We are introducing two new pastoral curriculums to support our students. Our Well-being Curriculum focuses on emotional literacy. We will equip our students with the necessary knowledge, skills, and attitudes to understand, manage, and express their emotions effectively so they develop resilience and confidence in themselves.

Secondly, the behaviour curriculum, through positive reinforcement and explicit practice, will support our students in understanding and performing key routines and habits around our school environment. Based on staff, student and family feedback we are also launching our new behaviour policy, that focuses on de-escalation techniques and reflection, to allow our students to make correct choices, so they can have a positive school experience and successful academic journey.

As a proud member of The Charter School Trust since 2012, I am really motivated and passionate about student wellbeing and development. I believe that if students have a balanced education of well-being and care alongside high expectations and hard work, our students can be successful and positive members of our school and wider community.
