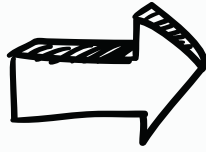

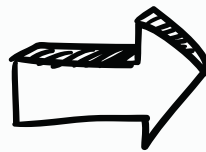
FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS – COMMUNICATING WITH TCSED

Please contact the office as they will have the most up to date information for you if there is a system issue, can arrange for biometrics to be completed and can check we have the correct details for you.

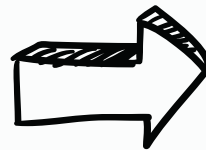
My child is struggling in a particular lesson as they cannot access the work. This includes being unable to get onto their google classroom for that subject. Who should I contact?



Please contact your child's subject teacher in the first instance. All teachers are contactable via email: firstnameinitial+surname@chartereastdulwich.org.uk

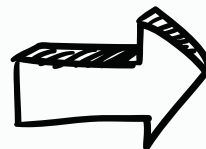
You can find your child's teachers name on their timetable

My child is unwell and will not be in school.



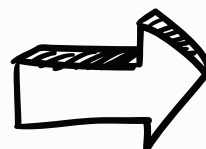
Please call the school each day that your child is off, or let our attendance officer know when we can expect your child to be back in school. Failure to notify the school of a return date or an absence each day will result in unauthorised absences.

I don't think my child is receiving the correct level of support in their lessons for their needs.



Please contact your child's subject teacher in the first instance. If you suspect that your child requires further support, subject teachers can discuss this with our SENDCo who can look into the issue.

I am concerned about a behaviour incident that my child has disclosed. Who do I report this to?



All behaviour concerns should be reported to your child's form tutor, unless it is a specific safeguarding concern, in which case you can contact your child's HOY (Ms Illidge) or Ms Graham, Assistant Headteacher for School Culture. Your child's tutor can then streamline this concern for you.
