Year 13 Results 2023



- ❑ The overall average Grade across all subjects was B with an APS of 35.7
- ❑ 27% of all A level grades sat by students at the school achieved A*/A
- ❑ 53% of all A level grades sat by students at the school achieved A*-B
- ❑ 50% of students achieved at least one A grade or equivalent
- ❑ 58% of BTEC grades were Distinction or Distinction* with 91% of students achieving a Merit or higher
- ❑ 80% of students went on to their choice of university or apprenticeship including Oxford, Cambridge, Manchester, Leeds, Police apprenticeships
- ❑ Top subjects included Maths, Art, Further Maths, Physics, Biology and Drama



Year 11 Results 2023



- ❑ 77% of students gained a standard or above in both English and Maths
- ❑ 58% gained a strong pass in both English and Maths
- ❑ 45% of students gained the English Baccalaureate
- ❑ 59% of students gained at least one grade 7-9
- ❑ 62% of students gained at least five GCSEs at Grade 5 or higher
- ❑ 45% of all BTEC results were a Merit, Distinction or Distinction*
- ❑ Top subjects included Further Maths (89% 7+), English (78% 5+), Maths, Sociology, Science, History, PE and Sports BTEC

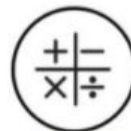

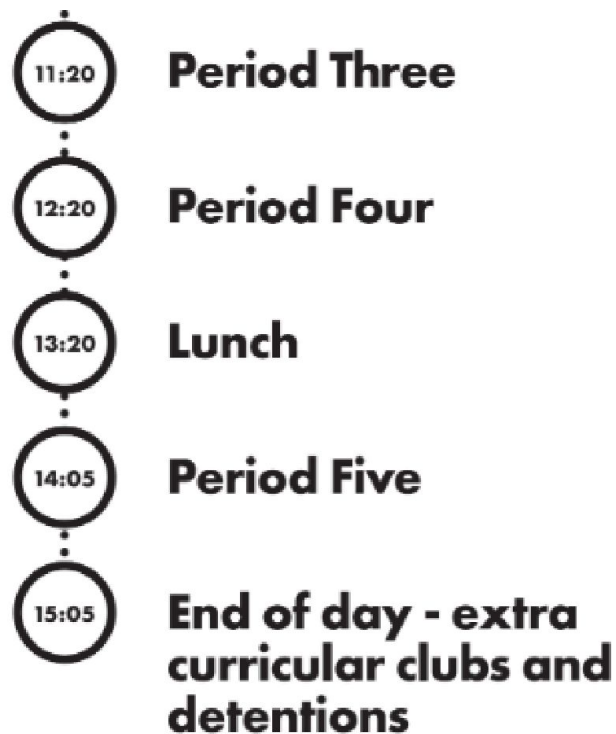
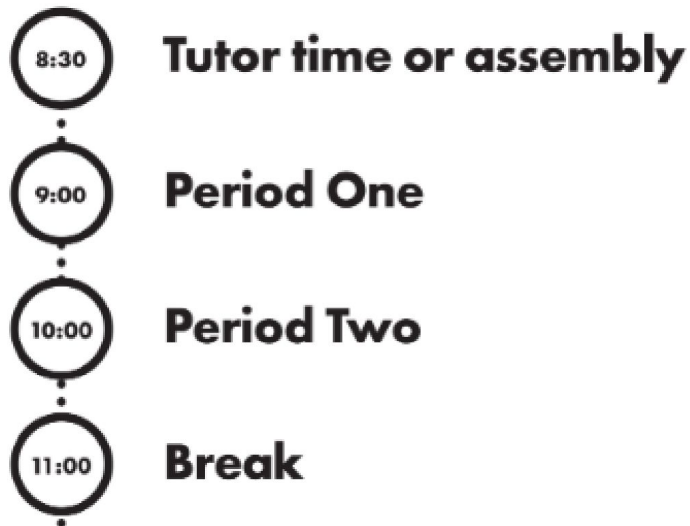

Bowie House

Born in Brixton, David Bowie (1947–2016) was a trail-blazer of musical trends, a singer-songwriter and icon who became one of the most influential musicians of the 20th and early 21st century.



Boyega House

Born in Peckham in 1992, John Boyega is most known for his role as Finn in the latest Star Wars trilogy. Following his powerful speech in support of Black Lives Matter, John has become one of the most respected Black voices in Britain.



James House

Afro-Trinidadian historian, journalist and playwright Cyril James (1901–1989) was one of the most influential voices in post-colonial literature.



Jowell House

Tessa Jowell (1947–2018) was Member of Parliament for Dulwich and West Norwood from 1992 to 2015 and an early sponsor of The Charter School East Dulwich.



King House

Augusta Ada King-Noel, Countess of Lovelace (1815–1852), an English mathematician and writer widely regarded as the world's first computer programmer.



Marson House

Writer, broadcaster and social activist, Una Marson (1905–1965) helped promote women and minority rights in the UK from the early 1930s to the late 1950s.



Faraday House

Born in South London, Michael Faraday (1791–1867) was one of the greatest scientific discoverers of all time. Mainly self-educated, his works helped define the modern study of both physics and chemistry.
